



IOWA 72 HOUR REGISTRATION AND FUEL TRIP PERMIT INSTRUCTIONS

Designated truck stops are required to have these instructions posted or made available for customers. **Under no circumstances are truck stops to advise whether a registration or fuel trip permit is needed. It is the responsibility of the applicant to determine whether a registration or fuel trip permit is required.** Foreign trailers displaying proper licenses will be granted free plate reciprocity. No trip permit or Iowa registration is required. Numbers 1 and 2 apply to registration requirements; numbers 3 and 4 apply to fuel requirements. Iowa registration trip permits are valid for 72 hours. Iowa fuel trip permits are valid for one trip in 72 hours.

*Vehicles licensed in Alaska must purchase a registration trip permit.

1. Vehicles licensed in any of these IRP jurisdictions and meeting any one of the following definitions must obtain a \$10.00 registration trip permit if not apportioned. Trip permits are valid for 72 hours. Each departure and re-entry of the vehicle into Iowa will require a new registration trip permit.
 - a) Gross weight of power unit exceeds 26,000 lbs. (11793.401 Kilograms), OR
 - b) Power unit has three or more axles, OR
 - c) Combination gross weight exceeds 26,000 lbs. (11793.401 Kilograms), OR
 - d) Registered weight exceeds 26,000 lbs. (11793.401 Kilograms), OR
 - e) Intrastate travel requires Iowa registration.
2. All vehicles licensed in these jurisdictions will be granted registration reciprocity for interstate travel unless they are leased to a carrier who is responsible for their leased vehicle's registration and are based in an IRP jurisdiction, then #1 applies. Intrastate travel requires Iowa registration.
3. An individual operating a commercial motor vehicle licensed in any of these jurisdictions must meet one of the following requirements:
 - a) Enter Iowa with 30 gallons or less of motor vehicle fuel in the supply tank(s) of the vehicle and purchase motor vehicle fuel as the vehicle travels through the state. Evidence of motor vehicle fuel purchased in Iowa must be made available for inspection by Iowa law enforcement officers.
 - b) Purchase a \$20.00 temporary 72-hour fuel permit. Each departure and re-entry of the vehicle into Iowa will require a new temporary fuel trip permit.
4. Vehicles licensed in any of these jurisdictions and meeting any one of the following definitions must obtain a \$20.00 fuel trip permit, if they do not have a permanent IFTA permit. Each departure and re-entry of the vehicle into Iowa will require a new temporary fuel trip permit.
 - a) Gross weight or registered weight of power unit exceeds 26,000 lbs. (11797 Kilograms), OR
 - b) Power unit has three or more axles, OR
 - c) Combination gross weight exceeds 26,000 lbs. (11797 Kilograms).
